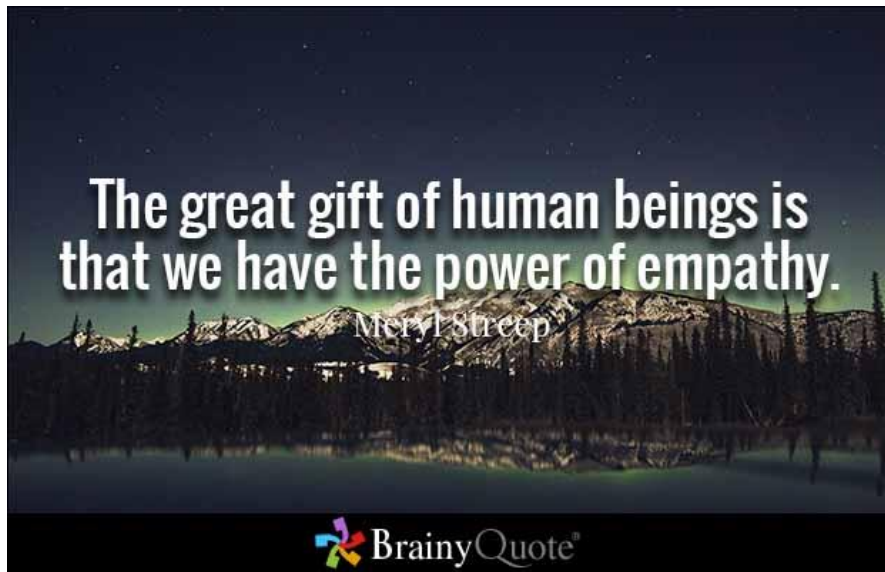


Bailey Road HEART
