



A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL - MR KELLY

Nau mai, haere mai

As I write this today the nominations for our Board of Trustee elections have closed. We plan to provide an opportunity for those standing to answer any questions you may have at our Talanoa on Thursday 14 August.

We look forward to seeing you then. The theme of this Talanoa is developing our new Strategic Plan for 2026-2028. Our staff will be available to talk about what we do and what might be possible. I watched 7 Sharp last night and was heartened by the item on the importance of handwriting. At our school we sample our student's handwriting progress at the beginning of each term to provide tamariki evidence of their progress. All junior students practise their handwriting skills daily and many middle and senior students also do so - particularly if they have been identified to require additional support.

Like many things in our modern technologically minded times, handwriting fell a little out of favour. But the evidence is clear about the positive link between learning and the fine motor skills of handwriting.

At Bailey Road School we believe in students having a strong grasp of Basic Maths Knowledge, Basic Literacy Knowledge and Handwriting skill because we know that they are required building blocks of higher learning.

The less brain processing time a student has to use to work out 7 x 8 or how to write the letter Q, because they have saved such things to their long term memory, the more they can direct their energies to the more difficult tasks they have to face.

I hope to catch up with many of you on August 14.
