












#### KIND DONATIONS

### A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL - MR KELLY

Bula vinaka,

Last week we celebrated our marvellous Fijian students' culture and language. If you were able to attend our assembly last Friday you witnessed the fantastic dances our ākonga had prepared.

The work that is taking place to renovate Rooms 4, 5 and 6 is coming along nicely and we hope to have our students back in their own classroom in a week or so. We have the two relocated classrooms working out of our Whare Ahuru Mowai [library] at the moment and each have settled well into their temporary homes.

I was listening this morning to a radio report about the improvements schools have made with student attendance. We still have a long way to go but it is encouraging to see improvement is occurring. However, I wanted to address a couple of comments I heard.

- 1] That it is ok for little kids to miss some learning time because it only matters when they are older. RUBBISH the learning our littlest students do sets them up for success. Missing foundation learning in maths and reading/writing holds a student back in their learning for a very long time.
- 2] That overseas trips provide students with experiences that are more important than being in the classroom. RUBBISH overseas experiences are wonderful but they do not help a student to learn to read, write or understand maths. Catching up puts a lot of extra pressure on our students.
- 3] That if school were more engaging, students would want to come more often. RUBBISH schools are engaging, but there are things to be learned and here is the place we do it. We are not a theme park, we are not a holiday programme, we are a school and the foundation skills we teach are essential for a student's future success.

In the end, very few students get to decide whether they come to school or not. Whānau and caregivers decide. The habits of showing up and being punctual are two of the most important skills we can have as adults. Employers value these a great deal. Send your kids to school unless they are ill.

Bailey Road school aspires to have the best attending and most punctual students we can have but that can only happen if whānau and students share in our goal.




