A word from the Principal - Mr Kelly

Kia ora koutou.

Welcome back to term 3. The term has started well with events like the One Tree Hill College Careers Expo being an interesting insight for our Year 8 students to the college many will attend. Weather permitting we will have our Takaro Whānau event tomorrow morning, rescheduled



from last term. We have Eastern Zone Netball on Friday, which will give our talented netballers a chance to test their skills against other school teams.

We have been focusing really hard on our students being proficient with basic maths facts since the beginning of last year. This term we are making a real push to have as many students as possible exhibiting their mastery in this area. Helping at home is enormously important. Basic addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts are quickly learned with whānau support.

Our attendance target is 90% and we **will** achieve this. Our Year 4 to 8 students are aware of the contest to win cash for attendance. Each of our Kowhai and Rimu classes will be able to win a cash prize by achieving 90% or above attendance in term 3. All class members who achieve this will go into the class draw for the prizes. We currently average 82% attendance. This is too low for us to do our jobs properly. Think of it like a mechanic trying to fix your car when it isn't there.

We have signed off on the next stage of our Rata playground upgrade project and expect our brand new sandpit to be ready, behind Room 7, in the coming months. There will be considerable work done to our Rata classrooms [the junior school] this year and early next, so I apologise in advance for any disruptions.

It is great to have so many things happening in our school.
