

A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL - MR KELLY

Nau mai, haere mai

The term is nearly done and dusted. We have had quite a busy calendar in term one. We laid some new turf on one of our senior courts and are in the process of investigating options to replace our demolished playground.

Our student learning achievements in 2024 were very encouraging and these results can be seen in comparison to previous years on our website. Bailey Road School's 2025 Annual Implementation Plan is also available to view on our website.

A big theme this year, besides the rollout of new curriculum and structured approaches to the delivery of these, is the way the school will begin to incorporate the new AI tools into the work we do to bring about the best possible opportunities for your tamariki. This work will largely be around making teacher and administration workflows more effective, and allowing our community more seamless access to what we do. Student access to AI at school is an area we are investigating with care.

The Ministry of Education has set targets for schools to reach by 2030 regarding student attendance. Bailey Road School is working hard to reduce lateness and increase attendance. Our Above 80% attendance and below 20% lateness has proven a useful tool. Students are informed that they may not represent the school in school-time sports events or cultural presentations unless they are better than 80/20. This was our beginning point.

In Term 2 the requirement will be 82/18 as we move towards the Ministry requirements. In Term 3 this will lower to 85/15 where it will remain for the rest of the year. Coming to school regularly and on time is the single most powerful way to ensure your tamariki have the best possible chance of achieving their academic potential. Have a great break with your children and we look forward to seeing everyone on the first day of term 2, April 28.


