

Tēnā koutou!

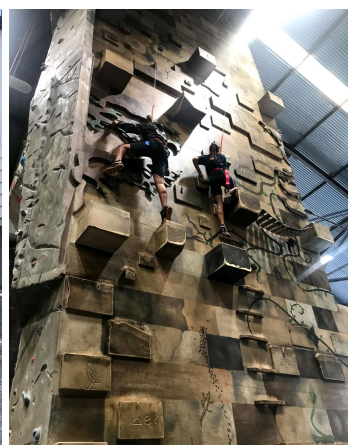
