You would have noticed that our Rātā Turf project has been completed and has been blessed. Our official opening is this Friday at 10am, you are welcome to join us.

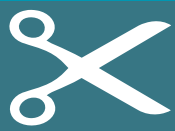


## BREAKFAST BBQ

# A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL - MR KELLY

Tēnā koutou kātoa

Bailey Road School begins our journey along the pathway of new reporting with our 2026 mid year reports. The Ministry of Education has authorised a transition period in 2026 where schools may choose the path towards the full adoption of the new report format in 2027.

We will include a helpful guide to our new reports in the envelope the report comes to you this Thursday. Here is a brief guide to what they will contain:

- front page - unchanged for this report
- Levels and Phases will still be shown side by side at this time

The Curriculum areas of Reading, Writing, Maths, CPW (Curiosity, Purpose, Wonder) [which is Science/Social Sciences/Technology and associated areas], The Arts, Health and PE, will all have their own comments section with information about what your child has shown us they can do, their next steps and also some suggestions in Reading, Writing and Maths about how to help at home.

Above each comment box will be a strip which will indicate the level of your loved one's Positive Attitude to that area of learning. Just above that will be the Progress descriptor, which is new, to tell you how your child is tracking along their learning in Reading, Writing and Maths, within the Phase they are currently in.

There are five progress steps:

**Emerging** [at mid year this student is not on track to reach expectations but is making some progress].

**Developing** [at mid year this student is not currently on track to reach expectation, but with significant effort has the potential to do so].

**Consolidating** [at mid year this student is on track to potentially achieve end of year expectation].

**Proficient** [at mid year this student is achieving, or is very near to achieving, the end of year expectation].

**Exceeding** [at mid year this student is achieving as well or better than at end of year expectation].

Enjoy your child's educational update and enjoy your holiday, we will see you next term.
