A BIG thank you to our Havea Aiga (Blast Entertainment) who helped us with the bouncy obstacle course. It made our Fun Run even more FUN.












## **DIWALI**

The celebration of our wonderful Niue students' language and culture brought to an end our language celebrations for the year. It is wonderful to celebrate some of the large population groups' culture and language during our celebration weeks. We have a wonderfully diverse community of students at Bailey Road School and many languages and cultures work together showing our students how we can all work harmoniously, learning from the strengths that each of us brings to our school.

We had a blow up whale visit or school last week. The whale was part of a Project Jonah school experience to teach our students about the protection and conservation of our aquatic cousins. The whale was so large half a class at a time could sit inside it and learn about the internal workings of whales. It was pretty cool and a good example of the wonderful and diverse experiences we bring to our tamariki is often as we are able.

We are assessing students and writing their reports at the moment and will soon be able to share the progress your tamariki have made over the course of this year.

Our Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei Health team will be onsite on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December from 1pm to 4pm - come see the team to receive your free immunisation. Please note - we require parental/guardian consent to immunise tamariki.
